MENTORING PROGRAM EXTENDED

The AAUW/Whittington Mentoring program kicked off its second year in February 2009. Originally scheduled and funded as a one-year program, it has been extended at least through the end of the school year. The eleven Whittington teen participants emphatically did not want the program to end and the twenty mentors were committed to a person to extend their commitment of time and heart. To seal the deal, we still had program money in the coffers. The second installment from the AAUW Community Action Grant arrived in early 2009 and we were able to stretch the dollars that were contributed by other generous sources last year. We've learned that the most important facet of the program is not the bells and whistles, but simply our time with the teens--caring, listening, sharing, guiding, learning and having fun.

On a cold and snowy January evening, mentors and volunteers made their way to the inviting home of Karen Thompson Pequignot. It was time for celebrating, sharing perspectives and setting direction for the next months. Survey results from mentors, staff and teens were shared and formed the basis for planning the next months' programming.

The program's format will continue with group gatherings on the second and fourth Tuesday of the month. Carol Durham will continue to facilitate discussions with the teens on building resiliency skills on the second Tuesday and will strengthen the emphasis on journaling. Fun programs such as the upcoming "Beach Party" will be coordinated by mentors and volunteers on the fourth Tuesdays. We will continue with creative Saturdays once a month including Easter egg dyeing, jewelry making, sewing/mending and the ever popular scrap booking. The third issue of the newsletter will be published in May. A sub-set of mentors will continue to provide tutoring on the first,

third, and fifth Tuesdays of the month. Finally, a few mentors will explore possible campus visits and a day trip.

It goes without saying that the local AAUW chapter has made this all possible. Thanks to all the membership for providing support through local grant money, extraordinary volunteer participation in the program, and ongoing encouragement by those members not directly involved. Our chapter continues to make a difference.

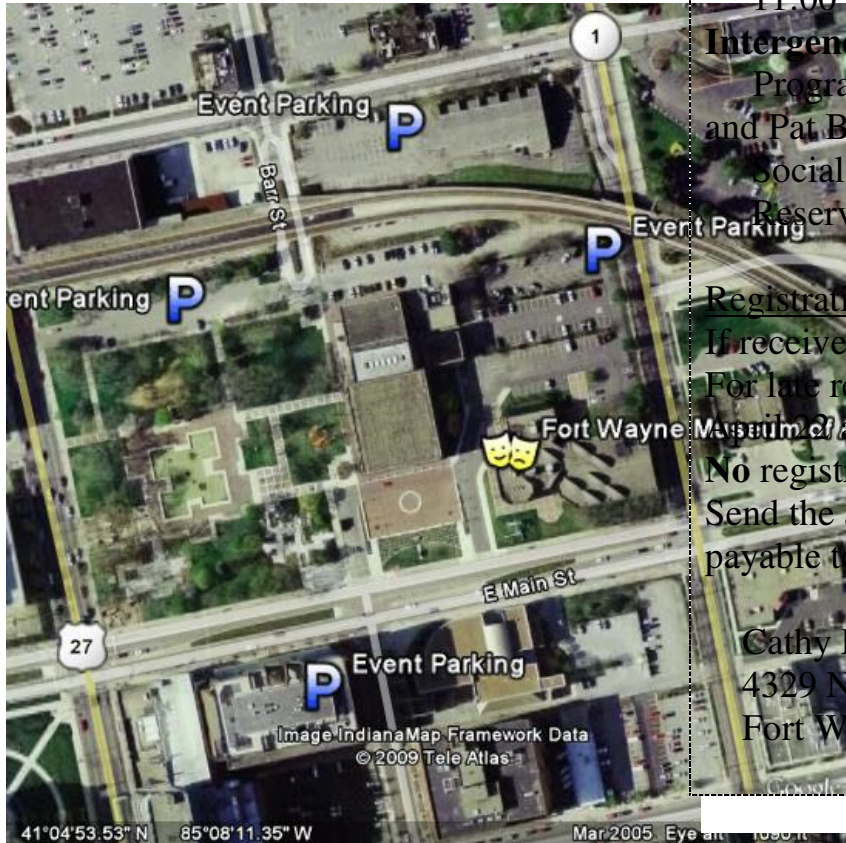
