Community Impact Project – St. Joseph Missions Women's' Shelter

I met with Erin Ness, Executive Director, in January. I toured the facility and learned how the organization helps provide emergency shelter and resources for single women in Fort Wayne. The organization has a variety of needs — tangible items as well as volunteer time. There is a <u>wish list</u> on their website and if you like, bring an item (preferably something listed as "urgent") to our March event and I will make sure it gets to the shelter. There is a <u>volunteer application</u> to help with office work, housekeeping, gardening etc. if that appeals to you. The women who come into the shelter (referred to as guests) bring very little — clothing and a few personal items. The staff at the shelter help replace identification cards, etc. Most have cell phones or can get a smart phone through an assistance program.

But the part of our conversation that intrigued me most was how our membership – current/retired educators, nurses, and businesswomen could **help in a unique way**. Erin and I brainstormed an idea and I need to hear from our branch members if we want to commit to this – helping the guests write down their work, housing and medical information to assist with job and housing applications and medical appointments. We also talked about how to help guests navigate Social Security.

Our idea is to help the guests build their personal data file and show them how to save and access it on their phones. It can help them complete a housing or job application faster (all the details will be right in their phone). They can create a way to store information about their current medications (take photos of their prescription labels and save to an album). Each guest could use assistance in creating documents that list their work, housing or medical history. The shelter has more than 10 computers that can used to help the guests set up a free gmail account, that comes with Google Drive for document storage. They can download an app on their phone and learn to edit documents as needed.

I know, some of you are thinking "Theresa, I am not computer savvy." Not everyone has to be – we need people who are great conversationalists and people who can help create documents! We would need members who can put the guests at ease and get them thinking about their history and how to phrase their skills. They weren't "just a waitress" but they "worked in the food industry, serving customers".

Erin and I talked about the possibility of a set day (& time) of the month that AAUW members would come into the shelter and help the guests that wanted help.

What do you think? Who would like to help develop this further? It would be great to have another member or two to work out the details for this project.
